#### ORDINANCE NO. 10 of 2016

AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF PLYMOUTH AMENDING ARTICLE IV ON-STREET METERED PARKING SECTION 131-24 HOURS AND DAYS OF OPERATION AND SECTION 131-25 DURATION OF LAWFUL PARKING OF ODINANCE NO. 3 OF 2016 AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 1 OF 2002 TO PROVIDE FOR A PURCHASE OF A PARKING PERMIT

WHEREAS, the Borough previously adopted Ordinance 1 of 2002 on February 12, 2002, which regulates traffic and parking in the Borough;

WHEREAS, said Ordinance was amended in parts by Ordinance NO. 3 of 2016 including Article IV On-Street Metered Parking § 131-24 Hours and Days of Operation and §131-25 Duration of Lawful Parking Periods;

WHEREAS, the Borough officials have determined that in the interest of promoting business along Route 11 the entire Main Street metered district that it would be beneficial to allow the purchase of an annual parking permit as an option to depositing coins in to purchase parking time;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED AND ENACTED by the Plymouth Borough Council that the Amendment to Ordinance NO. 3 of 2016 Article IV On-Street Metered Parking § 131-24 Hours and Days of Operation and §131-25 Duration of Lawful Parking Periods, which amended those sections of Ordinance No. 1 of 2002 shall be amended as follows:

## § 131-24 is amended to read as follows:

After the installation of said parking meters, it shall be unlawful for the owner or operator of any motor vehicle or other vehicle to park such vehicle for a longer period than the maximum time indicated on the dial of said parking meters between the hours of 9:00 AM and 6:00 PM, prevailing time, Monday through Friday inclusive and any of the following holidays: New Year's Day, Memorial Day, Independence Day, Labor Day, Thanksgiving Day, Christmas Day and Seasonal Shopping periods which the Chief of Police may designate. It shall not be a violation to park at a parking meter, in the metered district on or along Route 11 on Main Street, so long as there is displayed on the dash board, in an area which can be viewed through the front windshield of the vehicle, a valid parking permit for the current year issued by Plymouth Borough.

### § 131-25 is amended to read as follows:

When any vehicle shall be parked in any space adjacent to which a parking meter is located in accordance with the provisions of this article, the operator thereof shall, upon entering such parking space during the time of limited parking, immediately deposit a coin or combination of coins of the United States in such parking meter and operate the same according

to the instructions thereon. Failure to do so shall constitute a violation of this Article. Each twenty-five cents (a quarter) deposited, will allow thirty (30) minutes of parking up to a maximum of two (2) hours. Any vehicle parked in a space during the times specified in § 131-24 above, in which the meter shows that the parking time has expired shall be in violation of the Article and subject to the penalties and fines specified in this ordinance. It is noted that council from time to time by resolution can alter the charge and duration to parking, as well as the cost of a parking permit. Also, it is noted that there is no fee to park a motor vehicle in a Borough Municipal Parking lot. In addition as an option to placing coins in the meter to purchase parking time, an parking permit may be purchased as herein set forth for the use of parking meters on Route 11 anywhere along the metered district on Main Street, so long as the permit is displayed as set forth in § 131-24 above and the vehicle is parked at a meter. The permit shall be limited to one household or business that has an address on Route 11 on Main Street in the metered parking district. The permit will be issued on a yearly basis and shall be valid from First day of January of each year and expire on the thirty-first day of December of each year. The cost of a yearly permit shall be \$150.00 if purchased on or before January 1st through May 31st of each year and \$75.00 if purchased on or after June 1st through December 31st of each current year. The permit will be good for use only in the Route 11 Main Street metered district and will allow parking at a meter and in no other zone.

Ordinance No. 1 of 2002 and Ordinance No. 3 of 2016 remains in full force and effect unaltered except for the specific amendments set forth herein above.

This Ordinance shall become effective as provide for in § 3301.3 (b) of the Borough Code.
