ORDINANCE NO. 2 of 2018

AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF PLYMOUTH AMENDING Article II, Traffic Regulations §131-9 ONE WAY HIGHWAYS ESTABLISHED OF ODINANCE NO. 1 OF 2002

WHEREAS, the Borough previously adopted Ordinance 1 of 2002, which regulates traffic and parking in the Borough;

WHEREAS, a number of residents of Gould Street petitioned the Borough to make said street a one way regarding the direction of travel;

WHEREAS, at the request of the citizens of Gould Street the traffic commission conducted a study of Gould Street;

WHEREAS, the study revealed Gould Street is too narrow for traffic to safely travel in opposing directions on said street and therefore recommended it by made a one way street, traveling North, than East and South along said street as indicated in the attached map marked Exhibit "A", attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference thereto;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED AND ENACTED by the Plymouth Borough Council that Ordinance No. 1 of 2002, Article II Traffic Regulations §131-9 One Way Highways Established, shall be amended as follows:

Article II Traffic Regulations §131-9 One Way Highways Established is amended to included and add to the existing streets identified therein the following:

<u>IIIGIIWAY</u>	<u>FROM</u>	<u>TO</u>	DIRECTION OF TRAVEL
EAST GOULD ST.	VINE ST.	VINE ST.	NORTH
GOULD ST.	EAST GOULD	VINE ST.	EAST & SOUTH

Except for the amendments specifically made herein Ordinance No. 1 of 2002 and any prior and/or subsequent amendments thereto remain in full force and effect unless they are in conflict with the above amendments. Any provisions of Ordinance No. 1 of 2002 and any prior amendments to the aforesaid ordinance that are in conflict with the above are hereby repealed.

This Ordinance shall become effective as provide for in § 3301.3 (b) of the Borough Code.
