A RESOLUTION OF THE BOROUGH OF PLYMOUTH, LUZERNE COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA, HEREBY REQUESTS A TOTAL OF TWO HUNDRED TWENTY-TWO THOUSAND THREE HUNDRED FORTY DOLLARS (\$222,340.00) FROM THE PENNSYLVANIA GAMING LOCAL SHARE ACCOUNT UNDER THE COMMONWEALTH FINANCING AUTHORITY FOR THE PURPOSE TO REPAIR AND REPLACE MULTIPLE STORM DRAINS AND MANHOLES LOCATED WITHIN THE BOROUGH AND STATE RIGHT-OF-WAY. THE APPLICANT DOES HEREBY DESIGNATE GARY KOCHINSKI, PRESIDENT OF COUNCIL, AS THE OFFICIAL TO EXECUTE ALL DOCUMENTS AND AGREEMENTS BETWEEN PLYMOUTH BOROUGH AND THE COMMONWEALTH FINANCING AUTHORITY TO FACILITATE AND ASSIST IN OBTAINING THE REQUESTED GRANT TO REPAIR AND REPLACE MULTIPLE STORM DRAINS AND MANHOLES LOCATED WITHIN THE BOROUGH AND STATE RIGHT-OF-WAY.

Be it RESOLVED, that the Borough of Plymouth of Luzerne County, hereby requests a total of two hundred twenty-two thousand three hundred forty dollars and twenty-five cents (\$222,340.00) from the Pennsylvania Gaming Local Share Account under the Commonwealth Financing Authority of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania to repair and replace multiple storm drains and manholes located within the Borough and State rights-of-way which will improve the quality of life for residents of the Borough of Plymouth, Pennsylvania by improving the rideability of the roadways.

Be it Further Resolved, that the President of the Plymouth Borough Council is authorized to submit an application for said grant and forward the \$100.00 non-refundable application fee with said application. In addition, the President of Council is authorized to utilize the Borough Engineer to assist in the preparation of the application.

Be it FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Applicant does hereby designate Gary Kochinski, President of Plymouth Borough Council as the official to execute all documents and agreements between Plymouth Borough and the Commonwealth Financing Authority to facilitate and assist in obtaining the requested grant.
